Note: Additional coursework may be required if prerequisite classes have not been fulfilled. The typical course plan can be completed in three years, inclusive of a 6-month internship.

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Application and Audition Information

Application Due Date:

We only accept applications starting in the fall semester. For primary consideration, please submit your application and all associated materials by 2/15. We will continue to consider applications after this date; however, applicants are encouraged to submit their applications by 4/1.

Eligibility Requirements:

- A bachelor's degree in music (i.e., music education, Bachelor of Arts, etc..) or a related area (i.e., psychology, occupational therapy) with a minimum average of 3.25 (A = 4.0).
- If you are a non-native speaker of English, a TOEFL iBT 90, an IELTS score of 7, a Duolingo score of 130, or a PTE score of 65 is required for admission to the music therapy program. Individuals with lower scores may apply to the Intensive English Program.

Application Requirements:

- Complete the online **graduate application**, indicating the **MMT degree** in music therapy program at: <http://www.graduateschool.colostate.edu/prospective-students/apply/>
- Supporting materials needed for the application:
 - All prior transcripts. Unofficial transcripts are acceptable prior to admission; If admitted, official transcripts must be submitted during the first semester.
 - Current résumé.
 - A statement of purpose and career goals for graduate study at Colorado State University (limit three pages).
 - Personal History Statement. You will be asked to submit a statement about how your lived experience informs your skillset as it relates to the graduate program.
 - Contact information for three individuals submitting a letter of reference, including name, address, and email for all individuals who will submit letters on your behalf. There is no specific format required for letters of reference.
 - Video Audition. Music therapy students must demonstrate musicianship with voice and piano or guitar for the equivalency program. For the faculty to assess these skills, please submit the following:
 - A video of yourself singing and playing guitar or piano on 5 to 7 songs from different genres (i.e., American Folk, popular music, country music, world music, etc.). Please accompany yourself singing on all songs. If you play both piano and guitar, please demonstrate your skills on both instruments.
 - Optional: You may also elect to submit a video (no more than 5 minutes) of another instrument (i.e., flute, trumpet, electronic instruments), to further illustrate your musicianship.

Note: Scores from the general exam of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) are not required for students seeking admission to this music program.
